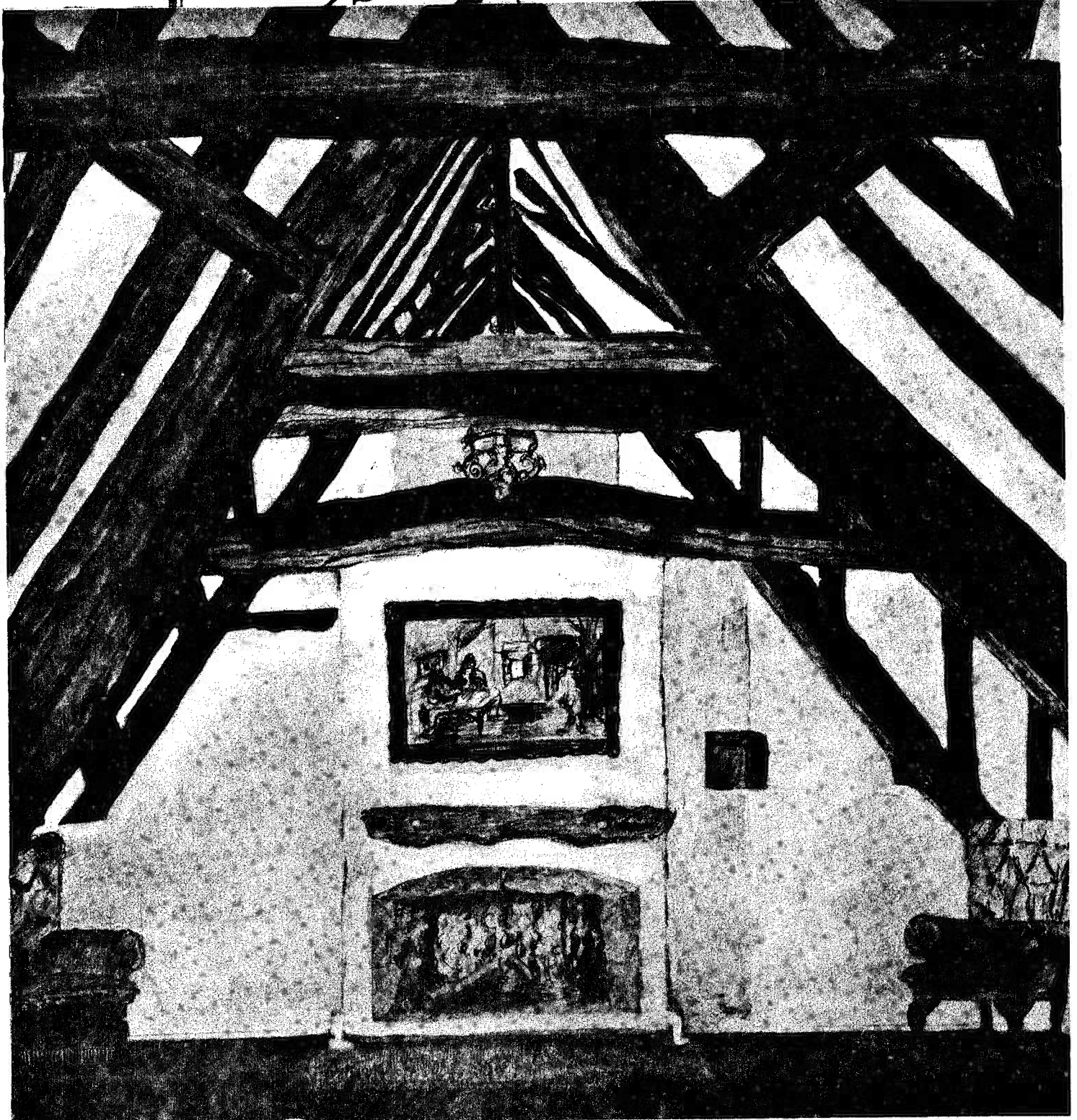

Editorial

The Village Appraisal questionnaire will be coming around next month with March's Chronicle. The questionnaire will include a housing needs section. Please support the Appraisal, even if all your comments are bad ones - the more replies the more accurate our soundings of village opinion will be. The results will be written up into a booklet and given to each household as well as organizations such as local councils and service providers. Don't expect miracles though - we may pinpoint things that need doing, but it will take more than the appraisal actually to make changes. It's a useful first step.

Bucks Council for Voluntary Service has sent us a copy of the updated MOBILITY GUIDE FOR BUCKS. It gives information about travel for disabled people: access to public buildings, car parks, toilets and so on. Ask us if you want to see it, or get a copy free from Bucks CVS, Walton House, Walton St, Aylesbury (some are printed on yellow card for people who don't see well).

A thumbs down in this respect for British Rail, who are building a brand new station at Leighton with no lift to get wheelchairs (or pushchairs, bikes, heavy suitcases etc. for that matter) between platforms. Up and down the steps with you. A great opportunity missed.

RECTOR'S REPORT

This month's deadline has crept up on me unawares - so brain and typewriter may not be fully co-ordinated.

What a strange thing our Calendar is. Every four years we need to have an extra day to balance things out.

February is a strange month. It still feels like winter yet many people hold that St Valentine's Day is the start of Spring. I don't mind it being extra short because it soon ends with March, which hopefully will be warmer and more Springlike.

February always seems to me to be a good month for dreaming. You can easily enjoy the armchair holiday of a lifetime - as many times as you care to choose. 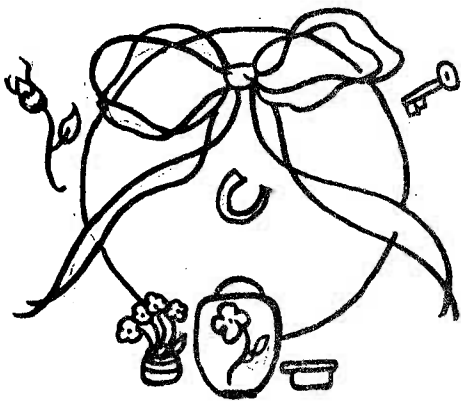

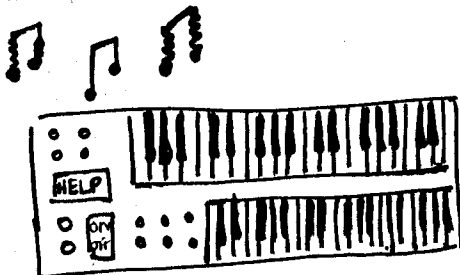

VILLAGE APPRAISAL

When you get your March Chronicle, you should also get a questionnaire. This is the Village Appraisal at last. This is an opportunity to make your views known on many things which affect our daily lives here - so please take the time to fill it in. Someone will come to collect the forms about a week after you get them (i.e. the weekend of 7th March) or you can leave them at the shop or at 2 Church Row.

We have been given a grant of £100 by the Village Projects Fund, which should cover most of the expense of printing the questionnaires and writing up the results.

(The Village Projects Fund was set up by Bucks Council for Voluntary Service and helps villages throughout the county)

RECREATION GROUND

The Rec Committee held a meeting on 21st January. The following notes may be of interest.

The Committee is now Caroline Lane (chairwoman), Chris Brandon, John Ford, Bridget Brandon, John Whyte, Lawrence Hinds, Margaret Kent, Vic Scott.

The Rec has about £300 in hand after paying for the new bench. (The Parish Council is in charge of finances.)

A new shed is going to be built on the old foundations in the far corner of the Rec, so please bear with us!

We decided to have a regular clean-up once every couple of months in winter, every month in summer.

Some bulbs and shrubs, possibly a tree, to be planted in the children's play area (the tree to give some shade in summer).

We discussed possibility of raising money for a hard tennis court/all weather surface and decided to sound opinion in the village appraisal (we may be able to get half the cost from AVDC).

If you haven't been to the Rec recently, do go and try out the new seat and admire the fencing around the play area! But don't let your dog into the play area or let it do its business on the Rec.



Unofficial notes from the Parish Council, 10th January

MONEY FOR LEISURE ACTIVITIES

By far the most interesting item was a talk by Bill Richards from Aylesbury Vale District Council's Leisure Services department. He told us that grants are available to help new leisure activities start up, or to enhance existing ones. They can finance up to half the cost of a scheme. Eligible schemes are very varied - indoor bowls, starting a new club, improving play areas, adding new attractions to a village fête, and laying a hard tennis court were all mentioned. They can also help with transport to events.

Interested groups should telephone Mr Richards on Aylesbury 395900 or write to him at AVDC Leisure Department, 84 Walton Street, Aylesbury HP21 7QT for more details.

Roads: Road sweeping and white-lining are to be done soon.

Planning: AVDC has granted permission for stables at 2 Abbey Cottages and for extensions and terracing at Lower Burston Farmhouse. The extension at Gatesgarth has been refused by AVDC.

The Parochial Church Council has been granted £50 for the year.

Street lights: we decided to replace existing white lights with new ones of similar design (still white) which have photocell units. This will come out of remaining funds for year ending April 1992.

Precept: we decided to request £3000 for 1992/3 (this money comes to the Parish Council from the community charge collected by AVDC). The sum is the same as last year.

Police: PC Garth Blaken is taking over as our community police officer. He is based at Ivinghoe.

Special notices:

- the Parish Council deplored the damage to the No Parking sign on the Green (part of it has been painted over)
- be sure to lock your cars at night. There has been a spate of thefts of radio cassettes in Wingrave and we may be next

DISCOVERING BUCKINGHAMSHIRE'S COUNTRYSIDE

Bucks County Council's series of guided walks and events continues, with full details available from the Assistant Countryside Officer on Aylesbury 383426. The following are not too far from home in February:

Sunday 2nd February Action in Pavis Wood A 2½-mile walk; bring stout boots and a picnic; have a try at coppicing. Meet Pavis Wood car park at llam (near Hastoe, just south of Tring).

Saturday 15th February Three Locks and Great Brickhill walk Greensand Ridge/towpath walk of 6 miles (3 hours). Park at Three Locks picnic site at 10am (A4146 Bletchley-Leighton near the Soulbury junction).

Sunday 16th February Walton Court Wander A 4-mile, 2½-hour walk on part of North Bucks Way and fields to Bishopstone and Sedrup. Meet Walton Court Shopping Centre West car park, Aylesbury, at 10am.

Sunday 23rd February Winter Wildlife at College Lake Join Graham Atkins, BBONT, for a 1½-mile, 1½-hour stroll around the lake to discover its wildlife. Park at College Lake for 2pm.

A MONTHLY LOOK AT FACTS YOU NEVER WANTED TO KNOW

LONG JUMP

The human flea, *Pulex irritans*, has a long jump of about 330mm (13in) and a high jump of about 200mm (8in) - or 130 times its own height. This is the equivalent of a human being jumping to a height of about 260m (850ft) - enough to reach the roof of a 70-storey building. The flea achieves this athletic feat by flexing an elastic pad beside its hind legs, and then suddenly releasing it - propelling itself into the air like an arrow with a built-in bow. Each time a flea jumps, it is subjected to a g-force 200 times stronger than normal, a strain that would kill most humans.

MILK TREE

Venezuelans collect milk from a herd that never moves. The South American milk tree, *Brosimum utile*, belongs to the fig family and produces a sap which looks, tastes and is used just like cow's milk.

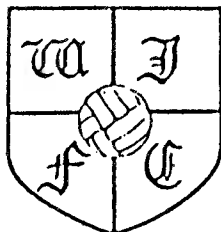

The villagers of Cublington are trying hard to raise enough money to finance the construction of an all weather sports area on their Orchard Ground playing field which is owned by the Parish Council.

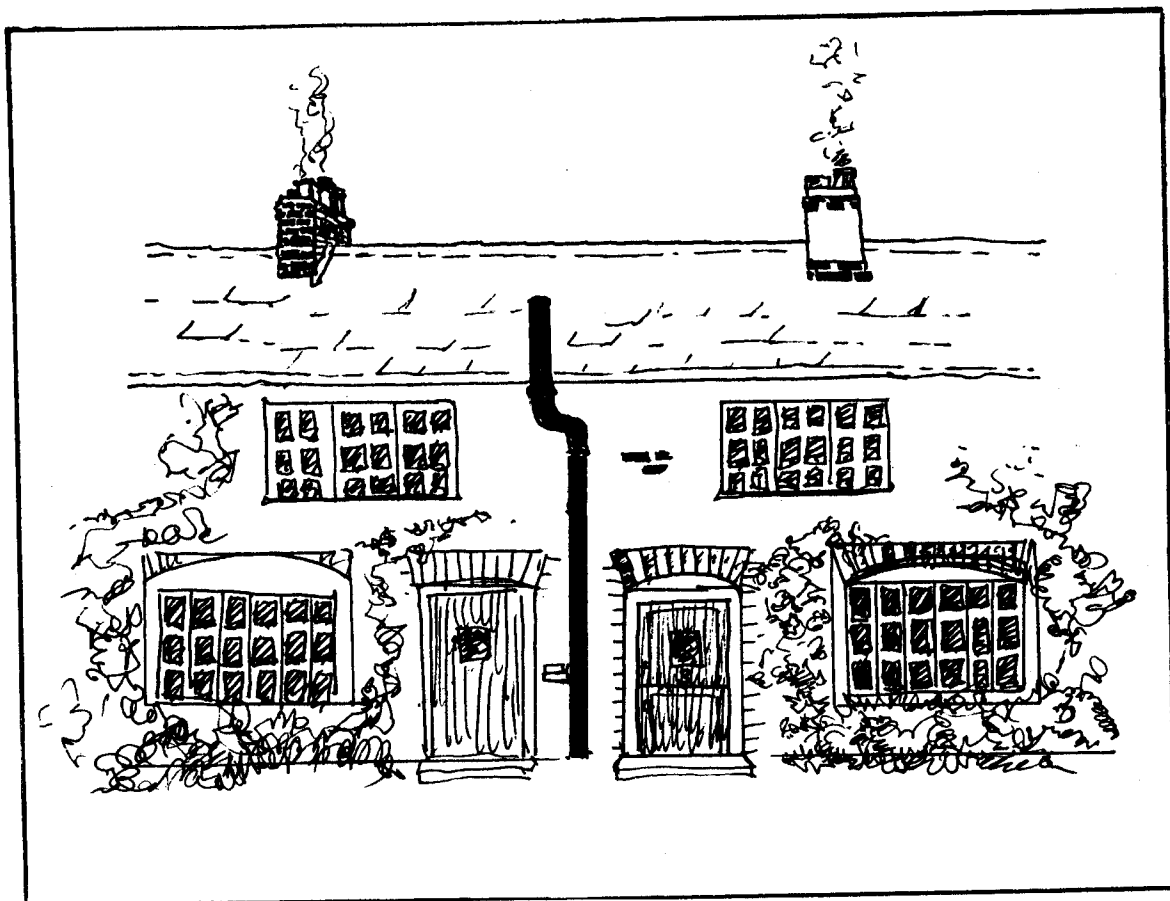
The Orchard Ground Committee have managed to obtain a grant from Aylesbury Vale District Council toward the cost of providing the sports area but this is dependant upon work being well advanced before April.

The Committee have first to construct a road within the field to allow access for heavy vehicles and work on this has started. There is however now an urgent need to raise additional money quickly to pay for the road.

To raise more cash the Committee have set up a 100/200 Club which will make its first payout to Members in February.

Are you prepared to help by buying Membership!! Tickets are on sale now for 1992 at a cost for the year of £12. From the money raised 55% will be paid out in prize money and of this 50% will be paid as a 1st prize, 30% as a second prize and 20% for the third.

Our services normally operate with a Conductor; yes we are old fashioned. If you need any help in boarding or alighting from the vehicle our Conductor will be pleased to assist.

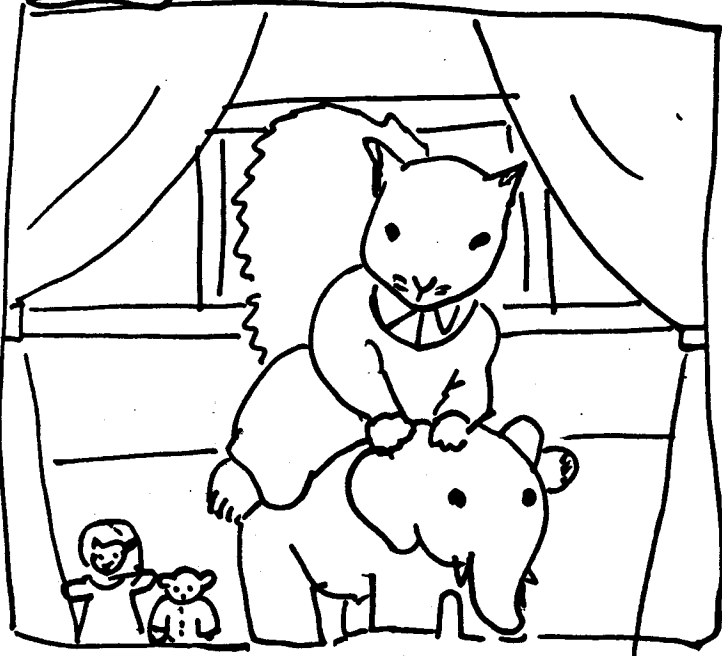

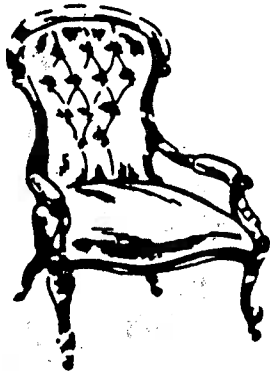

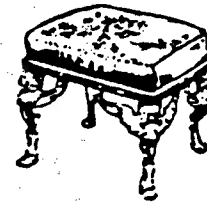
