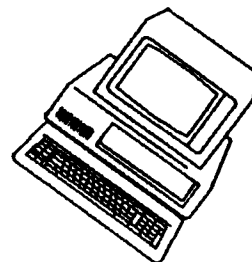

WINGRAVE CABARET *or The Return of Chesh's Organ*



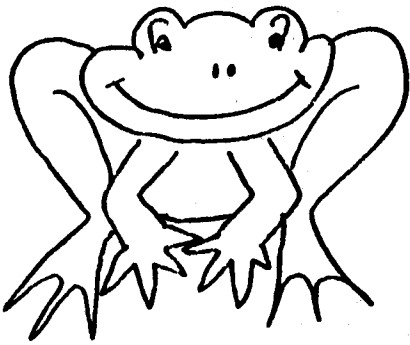

RECTOR'S REPORT

This month there is a changed Church of England. Although I am writing this before the General Synod gives its final approval to the Ordination of Women to the Priesthood, there seems very little likelihood that the Canon will not be Promulgated on February 22nd. Once that has happened the first Ordinations will take place next month.

To be honest, in the majority of churches in this country, there will be very little difference for some time. But, with the new possibilities comes also the procedures for not accepting the Ministry of Women, and ultimately of requiring alternative Episcopal arrangements. There are those within the Church who hold that if a Bishop has Ordained Women, he has therefore become tainted and thereby unable to provide the spiritual care that is needed.

But the question of Women Priests aside, there is another change that is facing us. Along with many other Dioceses in this country, our Diocese is exploring the idea of Local NonStipendiary Ministers. These will be people who are put forward by the local church, who will be locally supported in their training, and who, when trained will work as members of the local Ministry team.

This Diocese has a Pilot Scheme which is due to start in September 1994, and there is a strong possibility that Wingrave, Aston Abbotts and Cublington will be involved in this new venture - so 'Watch this space!'

If the changing face of the Church of England is not high on your personal agenda - as it mostly probably isn't - then just a brief reminder that through March we are in the season of Lent. This is the time of the year when Christians take stock of their lives as we work towards Holy Week and Easter. We remember what we have received from God in and through the life of Jesus Christ, and what we are called upon to give in response.

FRANCISCAN STYLE WORSHIP - at St. James's

In Aston Abbotts Church at 6.0pm on Sunday 27th March we shall be holding an Evening Service using material from the Society of St Francis.

This follows in a series of Services during which we have looked at different styles of worship. So far we have had Iona and Taize style services. The Franciscan style is far more traditional, although it stresses that worship should be a joyful celebration.

Much of the material that we shall be using will be familiar, although we shall be using the Franciscan version which has been designed for use by a Religious Community. Different people respond to different styles of worship - but how will you know whether or not you like it unless you are prepared to try it out?

St. James's Church Finances

A meeting was held in the church room on Saturday 29 January 1994 to which all members of the local community were invited, to discuss the financial problems faced by our village church at the present time. We were pleased to welcome David Haylett, Secretary for developing parish resources in the Diocese of Oxford, to this meeting.

Michael Hasler, the Parochial Church Council Treasurer, opened the meeting by pointing out that it will cost £91 per week to run St. James' Church during 1994. Our income for 1993 was an average of £84 per week.

David Haylett then explained that the largest part of the £91 which goes to the Diocese along with contributions from Wingrave and Cublington, covers only just over half the cost of providing for the services of our local Rector. It was also pointed out that our regular average income was provided by only 17 people out of a total village population of several hundred and that therefore the very existence of our church, which is here to serve the whole community, depends entirely on the generous commitment of a few.

Those people who were at the meeting were provided with a leaflet and pledge card. It is appreciated that not everybody could attend the meeting and if you feel that you would like to support the church, which is available for christenings, confirmations, weddings and burials for all the community as well as worship, then please would you contact Michael Hasler on 681877 who will be pleased to provide you with further details.

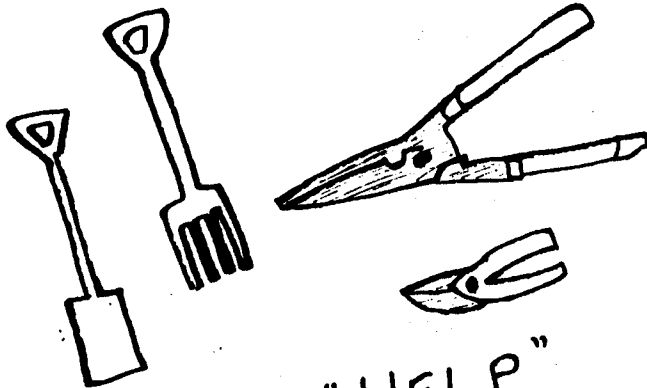

Planning applications

Bridge Farm, extension of farm buildings, no comment from parish council; goes to AVDC for decision
 Lower Burston Farm, conversion of barns to dwelling approved by AVDC
 Moat Farm, new farmhouse approved by AVDC
 Windmill Hill Barns, application for a house and paddock refused by AVDC (beyond built-up limits of village, would set a precedent, and against the local plans in an area of attractive landscape).

Accounts £170 for chains for new swings; electricity £24.70; hedge and tree planting at Rec, £94.88 (we have a grant for this sum from AVDC). Agreed to replace the Bricstock light which keeps going out with a new one, cost £99. A mowing quote for the Rec in 1994 received from Bucks County Council, £420, accepted.

AVDC mobile area office The District Council now has a van which can visit villages so that residents who find it difficult to get to Aylesbury can discuss matters of concern with council officers. The parish council felt that this would be of interest to villages a long way from Aylesbury but probably not here. However, if you would like AVDC to consider sending the unit here, please let Caroline Lane (681373) know and we will pass on the message.

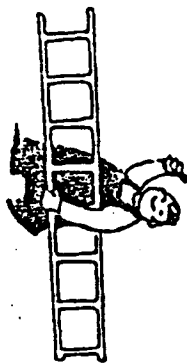

CHUPE (sp?)

My grandmother spent some of her early, much travelled years in South America and came home with this recipe. It's pretty much foolproof and the quantities are immaterial as long as you have enough cheese and cumin seed.

Sliced potatoes (cooked or raw)
Onions (preferably in rings)
Tomatoes (fresh or canned)
Lots of strong Cheddar
Cumin seed, slightly crushed
Slosh of milk
Salt and black pepper
Sunflower seeds (optional)



Grease an ovenproof dish and layer the vegetables (beginning with potatoes). Now and then put some grated cheese, cumin and seasoning in as well. Add the milk if it seems dry, particularly if you have used fresh tomatoes. Finish with potato, cheese and sunflower seeds and bake in a hot oven until the potatoes are soft (obviously it's quicker if potatoes are cooked, but I think nicer if done from raw). Serve with salad or green vegetable.
