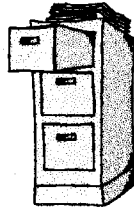

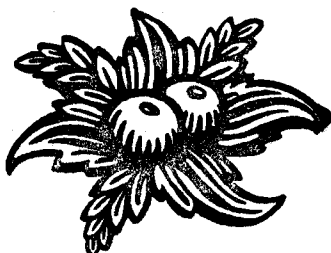
VILLAGE FETE 1997

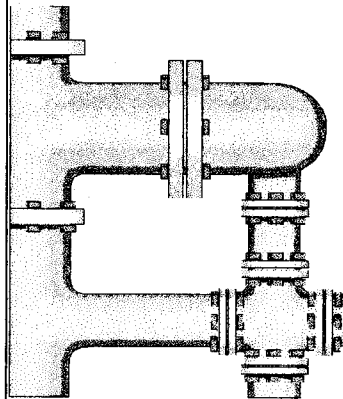

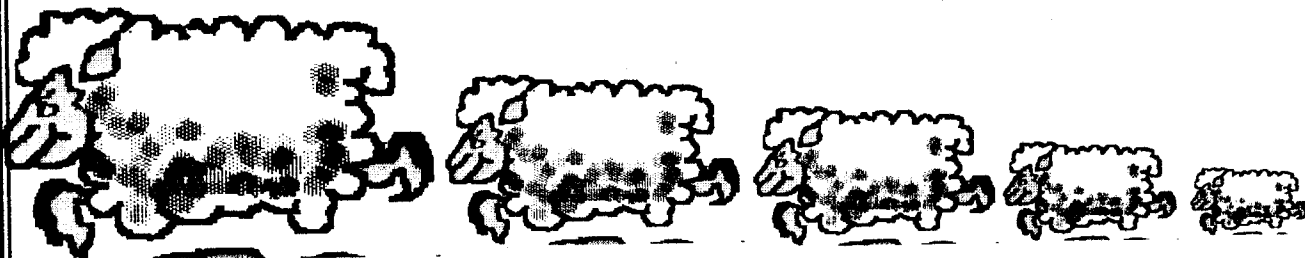

PARISH COUNCIL

*Unofficial notes of the meeting held on
Wednesday 16th April 1997*

1 RESIGNATION OF COUNCILLOR

Cllr Lane had received a letter from Cllr Biddle saying that unfortunately he had to resign as a Councillor. It was agreed to write and thank him for his work over the years. Cllrs expressed their regret that he was unable to continue on the Parish Council. Notices had been posted today for the vacancy and Mr Smith would deliver a leaflet to each household to invite anyone interested to apply to be co-opted if an election was not required.

2 WATER IN TELEPHONE KIOSK

BT had been to look at this problem and the ground was flat. AVDC had been informed and the ground outside had been levelled.

3 SPEEDING VEHICLES THROUGH VILLAGE

The Police would be asked to display the speed signs at the entrance to the Village.

4 RESPONSIBLE DOG OWNERSHIP

a) The Dogs (Fouling Of Land) Act - Designation Of Land

The Children's play area would be designated.

b) Application for poop scoop bins

As budgeted, the Parish Council would apply for a second bin possibly to be placed near the entrance to the Grove. Cllr Kempster would look for a suitable site.

5 LITTER BLITZ REQUIRED IN VILLAGE

There would be a litter blitz on 10 May. Volunteers to meet on the Green at 11 am.

6 REQUEST FOR SIGN TO HAYBARN INDUSTRIAL SITE

This was to be requested under the Weedon sign and for this to be lowered.

7 CONSIDER ENTERING BEST KEPT VILLAGE COMPETITION

The Village would not enter this year.

8 GRANT TO CHRONICLE

An immediate grant of £50.00 would be given to the Chronicle to the next Parish Council meeting. The remaining grant would be considered later in the year.

9 REPORTS

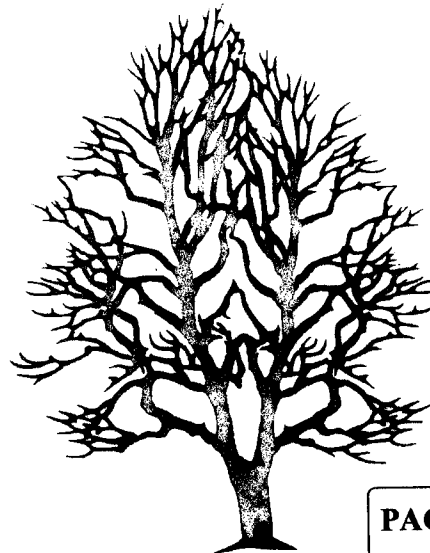
a) The concrete bollard supporting the Trig point at the top of Lines Hill had been knocked. This had been adopted by Mr Peter Knight as it was no longer in use by the Ordnance Survey. Mr Knight would take a look to see if he could put it back.

b) The Clerk, Mrs Taylor, reported that she would have to resign, with effect from 1 June 1997, as the family were moving to Somerset. She thanked councillors for their support. They expressed their regret at the resignation.

The date of the next meeting will be 21 May 1997 the Annual meeting of the Parish Council.

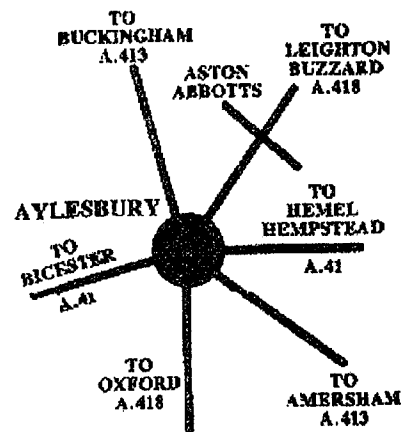

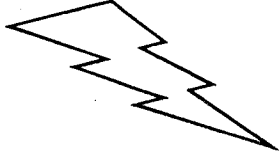

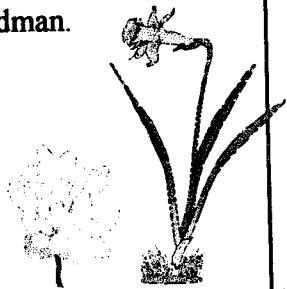

RECTOR'S REPORT - APRIL 1997

They tell us that this has been the driest winter for two hundred years, and we are being urged not to waste water.

I used to think that I understood the physics of evaporation and condensation and the flow of fluids. I thought that if the water came from the tap and flowed down the drain it was being returned to the processing plant to be recycled and pumped back to the tap. If the taps leak, as we are told they do to a very serious degree, then this means that the water is seeping back into the ground, from whence it can be abstracted from well, borehole, spring or whatever.

There was a logic in the evaporation/cloud and condensation/rain process that seemed fairly straightforward.

Maybe we are just going through a rather longer cycle this time round. It would be fascinating to know what the weather was like when the Hale-Bopp Comet was visible last time round. We know that history has been littered with periods of flood and periods of drought, some of which are recorded and others which we know very little about. Not only have there been times of wetness and dryness but there have also been periods of heat and coldness.

These are part of the history of our planet against which mankind has struggled for survival.

They are factors over which we can have no control - and that we find very irksome.

Many years ago I came across a spoof "Gardener's Prayer". It requested variable rainfall for different parts of the garden, because of the differing needs of the plants. It not only specified varying amounts of rain but also the differing times of day to suit the plants' optimum watering time as well.

The first Sunday in May this year is Rogation Sunday. Traditionally this was the day on which the wells were blessed and prayers were offered for the success of the coming harvest. It is a reminder of former days when the life of the village community was very much linked to the productivity of the soil. Although we tend to buy a considerable amount of our food from the supermarket these days, we are still dependant on the world of nature - and on a climate which is beyond our control.

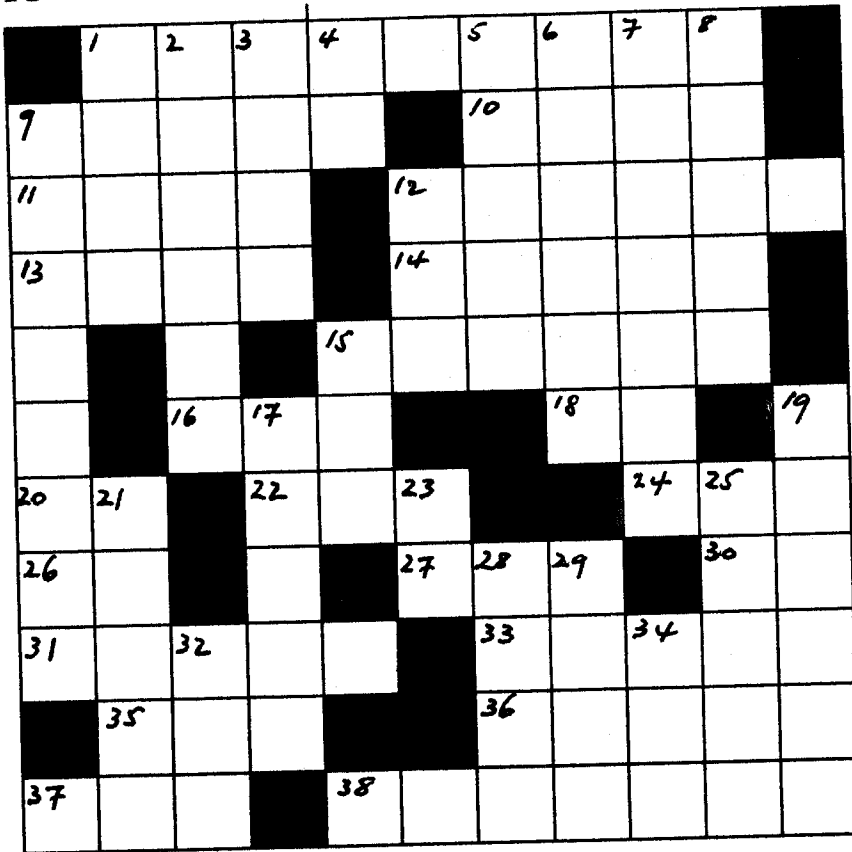
Could this dry spell be a reminder to us of the folly of not respecting the Creator and Source of Life?

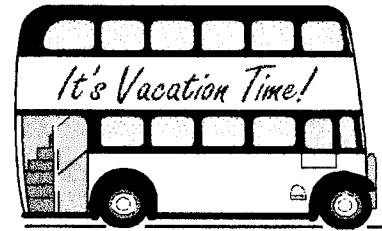

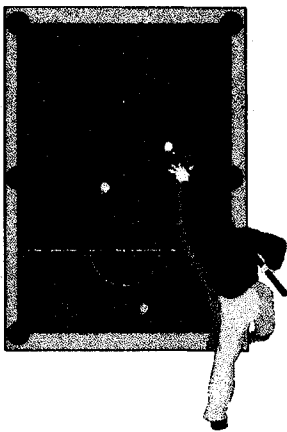

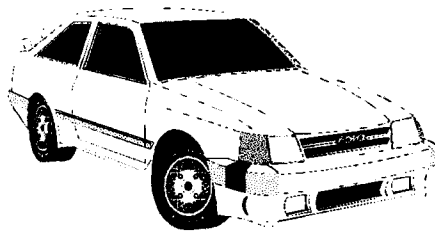

Volunteers are required for a gentleman who would like to go **fishing** and just needs a little help (no lifting or pushing involved).

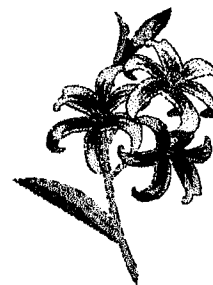
