#### PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Meeting on 1st July

Matters arising: Brenda Jennings (County councilior) said she would try to obtain a Kill Your Speed sign free of charge. She would also tell the County Council of complaints about the early bus to Aylesbury (the one used by schoolchildren and the public) speeding in the 30mph area.

Planning applications: agricultural building at Oak Farm, no comment from Parish Council; field shelter, off Weedon Road, no comment; kennels at Bridge Farm (near Rowsham), Parish Council expressed concern about noise nuisance to nearby residents. Continued use of mobile homes at Oak Farm had been granted by Aylesbury Vale District Council.

Accounts: Street light repairs, £29.08; electricity, £51.32. The books had now been audited.

Local Government Review: the Local Government Commission had presented three options (also widely circulated to the public). The Parish Council would write to reaffirm its view that retaining both County and District Councils (with the exception of Milton Keynes, which should be on its own) would be best for this area. [We think that the County Council on its own would be too large, and the District too small.]

Correspondence: a letter regarding a "Save Our Post Office" campaign had been received and would be printed in the Chronicle. [We now understand that the proposals to privatize aspects of the service have changed, so the letter is not being printed; contact Jim Reading at Aylesbury Sorting Office, 2 St John's Road, Aylesbury, tel. 0296 89450, for details.]

Benefits bus: this advice service, run by Bucks County Council, would be starting in September or October, visiting Wing on the second Thursday of the month.

Bucks County Council had suggested putting a new sign Weedon on the corner opposite the shop to discourage traffic going round the back of The Green when there are diversions because of accidents on the main road. [Following a site meeting with the Chairman and Clerk, this was agreed.]

#### 19th August

Matters arising: Kill Your Speed signs were not to be had free, so three were ordered at a max. of £50 each. A request for the 30mph speed limit area to be extended to include all of Moat Lane and Lines Hill had been rejected because development is not continuous along the route and there is no accident/injury record there.

Planning applications: Conversion of barn to dwelling at Norduck Farm, Parish Council objected to development in area of attractive landscape. No comment on agricultural building at Red Barn Farm. These now go to AVDC for decision.

Accounts: Wingrave Playscheme, £55; electricity, £19.18; accountants, £102; Playing Fields Association, £61 (safety inspection at the Rec.). Decided to close the Rec's current account and move the money into Rec's deposit account. £196.19 was received for the Rec from Fete Committee.


