




Thank you to everyone who participated in the carol singing around the village on Dec.21st.

RECTOR'S REPORT

There are three important elements in the VE Celebrations this month.

is THANKSGIVING. Fifty The first years ago there thanksgiving for deliverance from War. Now we need to give thanks for fifty years of Peace - and for the things that have been achieved because of that peace. There will always be those who will wonder whether the world has made real progress since 1945. There will always be those who have very sincere doubts about a United European Community. But, despite these misgivings, there is much for which we must truly be thankful.

If we find it difficult to think of much for which to suspect, we shall find it even thanks, then, Ι harder tackle the second theme of RECONCILIATION. Now I thought knew what 'reconciliation' meant. But just to be on the safe side I checked with the dictionary. It means 'bringing back to friendship'. That is something that none of us find terribly easy. We can speak about 'forgive and forget', but it's harder to practice what we preach. At one stage in the history of the Jewish Nation in the Old Testament there was a "year Jubilee". Αt the end of forty-nine years all debts were cancelled and the slate was wiped clean. Perhaps celebrate a half century of Peace in Europe, and later summer VJ Day, the time has come for us to spare a thought for Reconciliation. International friendship days seem to have the cold hand of apathy built in - maybe we should as individuals offer the warm hands and hearts of reconciliation more eagerly than we have sometimes done in the past.

But by far the most dangerous of the elements is that of HOPE. In the Service in St Paul's Cathedral, the section on led by young people from all be parts of the United Kingdom. Hope is always looking to the future. We know what has happened in the past. We know what is happening in today's for good and ill). But it is to the future world (both together will the young, look in hope. Hope should be a positive thing - although far too often our hopes of 'fingers crossed'. We hope things don't expressed in terms turn out too bad. Should we not be more positive and have high hopes for the next fifty years of peace in Europe? High for the future of our families, our nation and our world?

Thanksgiving, Reconciliation and Hope, are elements in our Victory Celebrations - and maybe we should not just sweep them aside when the festivities are over.

ADEC's FOOD and FARMING PROJECT



This year Aylesbury Development Education Centre is focussing its work and resources on issues around food and farming in Aylesbury Vale and the world beyond.

From here we make our way to Ellesborough, Great Kimble, Kimblewick, and Ford. With luck the pub in Ford should still be open, which is a good chance to take on more fluid (careful on the alcohol). Dinton castle next, and a long stretch to Waddesdon. Last year we were fortunate to have a friend in Waddesdon who gave us buckets of cold water to bath our feet in. This year this friend has moved, so we may have to suffer. The last stretch, which also seems never ending, takes us to Hardwick, and finally back to Weedon. The last part is the 'luxury' of driving back to Aston, and feeling very, very chuffed at having done the Ring.




