





St. George's Night Dinner





RECTOR'S REPORT - JUNE 1998

In May each year there is an exhibition of Christian Resources which usually takes place over about three days down in Surrey. Each year I plan to go and, each year, for one reason or another, I do not go. This year was no exception but I have the same sense of frustration, thinking that really I should have gone.

By all accounts, the exhibition is a bit like the Ideal Home Show, except that it is all to do with churches. It has everything that might conceivably be wanted, from hymnbooks to heating, insurance, books, Bible study material, sound systems, church charities and, inevitably, computer software.

It seems such a good idea and well worth a day out to catch up with the latest ideas. And, when you consider that it is not an exclusively Church of England exhibition but spans all the Christian denominations, then it seems to be an even better idea, yet I always seem to miss it!

But, perhaps this is a good thing because, if I came back full of trendy ideas, having seen all these new gadgets and gizmos to make life easier for the Church, I think that I would end up very frustrated. After all, most of the problems in the Church are not capable of being sorted out by buying the latest gadget. The situation is no different from our ordinary everyday lives where in the back of the cupboard we have the thing that looked as though it was going to be the answer to all our prayers, but experience showed us otherwise.

There are many good and useful things that we shall need to consider - gadgets which will help us with our problems - but we need to think very carefully before we invest in them. There are other problems in the Church which will probably resolve themselves without our interference over a period of time, even though they seem to be rather a nuisance at the moment. Then there are the problems which can only be resolved by making sure that we do the hard work involved in doing a thorough job.

Every five years all Churches are inspected by their architect and that tells us which jobs we need to be tackling as priorities as far as the building is concerned. However,

there are also other areas where we need to invest for the future - organs need to be overhauled periodically, heating systems need upgrading, new technology brings more effective and efficient ways of lighting the Church. We need to consider access for the disabled and amplification systems for the hard of hearing, and so on.

Maybe I should have gone after all - must try again next year!

We would like to draw your attention to the following guidelines issued by County regarding Admissions to Primary Schools in Buckinghamshire 1998-99

"It is no longer possible to guarantee a place for a child at his or her reserved area school if the parent or guardian has not expressed a preference for the child to attend that school. All of the children whose parents/guardians have expressed a preference for a school must be considered for places before we can consider children with no expressed preference for a place at the school."

We would therefore request that if you wish your child to attend Wingrave School you ring the school and give them your child's name as soon as possible. If we do not receive a completed preference form by the required date it will no longer be possible to guarantee your child a place at this school even if you live within the reserved area for the school.


