





ALLOTMENT DIARY

When I saw Simon Guy at the allotments recently, he presented me with a copy of a magazine called "Allotment & Leisure Gardener", which he thought might give me some ideas for my monthly column. (He kindly didn't suggest that it would improve the standard of the rubbish I usually write).

I therefore looked through it. One of the first articles was one headed "Children on Allotment Sites", which began by saying that we should welcome and encourage children at allotments, a view with which we would probably all agree. However it then went on to say that there were a number of actions that should be taken for the safety of the children if we were to do this, and I read on with incredulity. The actions included:-

- 1. Risk Assessments must (my italics) be carried out.
- 2. If school visits were made (an unlikely event I would have thought), there should be enough adults to supervise the children.
- 3. In no circumstances should children be allowed to wander around the site unsupervised.

I try hard not to become grumpy and cantankerous in my old age, but really! An allotment is basically a garden specialising in growing vegetables rather than flowers. Would anyone in their right senses carry out a risk assessment before allowing their children to play in the garden! Yes, there may be sharp tools – spades, forks, rakes, etc. - on an allotment; and there may be some things that one would prefer that children did not drink, such as most brands of weedkiller; but there will be nothing on the average allotment that one could not find in the average domestic garden or garden shed. Normal commonsense will mean that you will tell your (or anyone else's) children not to play with the tools, and not to drink anything in the bottles, and you will make sure they don't!

Should one carry out a risk assessment before allowing ones children into the kitchen? There are far more dangerous implements in there! And the main reason for not letting children to wander around an allotment unsupervised is not the safety of the children, but the safety of the plants!

Having just returned from an extended period of time away, and had to deal with the vast crop of weeds that had grown on my allotment during my various absences, I was interested to read an article by the head gardener at Audley End, who began by saying "all thoughts of holidays and days away from the plot must now be given serious consideration, and dare I say it, put off until further notice"! While he does have a point, it is undoubtedly a good example of the tail wagging the dog! While we allotmenteers very much enjoy our allotments, there is life to be lived as well!

I have thus far in writing this column avoided giving any gardening hints, on the basis that I was certainly unqualified to give them. However I will pass on two tips which may be of use, both of which stem from my recent experience. When I went away in early June, I sprayed "Roundup" on that part of my allotment upon which I was not already growing vegetables. When I got back two weeks later, I found that it had successfully killed all the weeds except one: my nettles on this part of the allotment were continuing to thrive – some looking a bit spindly and poorly, but still growing – and were clearly benefiting from my having killed off all the competition! Clearly, one spraying of "Roundup" is not enough to destroy nettles: you need a second application.

Secondly, when I went away, I left my row of peas growing quite happily. By the time I got back they had hardly progressed because some bird or birds (Vic tells me they were probably pigeons) had been feasting on the leaves. I have now put netting all round them, and am hoping that enough of the leaves has remained to enable the plants to be resuscitated. Vic told me that he planted some young pea plants out this spring, intending to net them the following day. By the time he came to do this, the plants had been so badly eaten that they did not survive. If my do, therefore, I will have been lucky! The same problem occurs with cabbages and other members of the brassica family. If you want to grow any of these plants, therefore, remember to net them during the spring.

SIAS Inspection

The diocese of Oxford inspected the school on Thursday 3rd April and you should have all received a copy of their report. We were very pleased with the findings of the report which state 'there is much that is currently good about this school'. The school was graded as 'satisfactory', which is the highest grade allowable due to the school being in special measures.

Ofsted Action Plan

There are 4 main headings in the action plan: Achievement and Standards, Teaching and Learning, Leadership and Management and Care, Guidance and Support. All key points and actions taken so far are covered in this newsletter. Mrs McClellan is meeting regularly with governors and staff to keep everybody updated on progress. The Inspectors are due back for an interim visit before the end of the summer term. They will review progress against the key issues originally raised and then publish their findings. We will, of course, keep you updated on this.


Headteacher

Teaching and Learning

Subject co-ordinators are currently completing forms detailing training courses they have attended. They will be reporting on the impact these courses have had on the whole school and how this will inform the planning of their subject for next year. There has also been a total review of the delivery of the science curriculum in KS2. A staff meeting has been held to discuss every child in the school, to ensure all necessary intervention strategies are put in place. An Advanced Skills Teacher and a Maths advisor have been working with staff. Also, maths and literacy advisory teachers will be attending school after ½ term to work with members of staff. Lesson observations by the HT have taken place in all classes. Work is continuing on improving the planning, differentiation of lessons and marking of work, to ensure that all children are being appropriately challenged and that they know what they need to do in order to improve their work.

Tracking System

Staffing Structure

Policies

Library

A new package has been agreed with County which will upgrade the stock of books and also allow for additional books to be borrowed thereby increasing the variety of books on offer. All KS2 pupils now have a new style form for recording the books they borrow from the library. This will help to develop their reading skills by ensuring they are reading a wide range of books.

Special Educational Needs/Gifted and Talented Children

We are reviewing the SEN practice across the school and have also appointed a very experienced SEN governor to work closely with the SEN co-ordinator. A new role of Gifted and Talented co-ordinator has been created and a new policy is currently being written. You should have received a letter this week from Mrs Britnell with regard to gifted and talented children.

Lunchtime

An additional supervisor will be present to help the younger children on the days hot lunches are served. This will be either Mrs Searles or Mrs Boughton.

Premises

The whole school (inside and outside) is to have additional maintenance work carried out, including decorating where necessary. This should greatly improve the appearance of the school. New (or nearly new) tables and chairs have been sourced and will be arriving at school soon. A Health and Safety audit is to be carried out by County after half term.

May Day

The annual parade through the village took place on a lovely sunny day, with small bouquets of flowers being handed out to the elders of the village. This was followed by some very energetic dancing by all children (and some of the staff!) This is a wonderful tradition and shows how much the school is at the heart of the community.

Rising 5's

Mrs McClellan and Mrs Abbott have visited Cublington pre-school and will be visiting Wingrave pre-school shortly to build up a good relationship with staff and pupils. The new Wingrave pre-school leader has also visited the school. A meeting was held on 12th May with parents of the children who will be joining the school in September this year. The parents met with Mrs McClellan, Miss Carter and Mrs Abbott. Parents obviously asked questions with regard to the Ofsted report and the actions being taken, but we are hopeful that any concerns have been answered and parents are happy that the school is making good progress on issues raised.

Prospectus, Website and Parents Handbook

The prospectus is currently being updated and should be available for use after ½ term. Work has been carried out on the website to modernise it and make it more 'user friendly', however the content is still to be updated. Why not have a look at it at www.wingrave.bucks.sch.uk. We are also in the process of updating the Parents Handbook which includes all information parents should need such as names of staff, governors, PTFA members and class representatives. It also includes administrative arrangements, school uniform and diary dates etc. This will be issued annually to all parents at the beginning of the school year.

Parents Evening

Comments on the questionnaires handed out at parents evening were very positive and supportive. It would appear that parents are happy with the improvements made on the information given to them about the progress of their child/ren. All comments have been noted and will be taken into consideration at the next parents evening.

Parents Skill List

A letter has been sent to all parents requesting details of any particular skill or expertise which could possibly be called upon by the school as and when needed. We would be grateful if this could be returned to the school if appropriate.

Finally



Countryside Matters

As I write this column, the good news is that the first batch of one million doses of Blue Tongue vaccine has already been supplied to livestock farmers, with the second batch of two million following closely behind. Let's hope this halts the spread of this very nasty disease to cattle, and the protection zone, expanded county by county. How strange as soon as one disease appears to be under control another one pops up. The H7 poultry virus found in chickens in Bambury this morning 4/6/08 is not harmful to humans.

Returning to the bio fuels debate and the production of ethanol for alternative fuels. The EU renewable transport fuel obligation, (TFO to us peasants!), states that fuel suppliers must ensure that bio fuels account for 2.5% of fuel at the pumps now and rising to 5% by 2010. This means that it will require 40% of EU farmland to be turned over to bio fuel crops, to meet the EU's own 10% target, cutting vastly our own ability to grow food to feed ourselves which is already having the effect of forcing prices much higher. (As reported in this column back in the winter). Who are these EU nutters? Let out on day-release? They put the 'mental' back into environmentalists.

The Russians clearly have the right idea, they are building 30 new plants to produce two million tonnes of fuel ethanol each year for domestic and export markets. They are already building a plant in the Tamlov region to produce 250,000 tons yearly, mostly from wheat.

Am I going mad as well? No, not quite, the Russians have 40 million hectares of unused arable land that supply energy crops without affecting domestic food production. There is less than 6 million hectares of arable land in the U.K. – that's all. The Russians apart from running the gas supplies to the U.K. and possibly the oil supplies eventually, they shall definitely hold all the aces on future ethanol production. Feel better now? I thought you would.

When there are only a few weeks of wheat stocks left in the world and a much smaller proportion of rice available, why do these politicians still talk rubbish? Although of course, alternative energy is paramount, but surely not at the expense of vital food production.
