

Progress has at last been made with the Church's solicitor and investigation is being initiated to agree the cost of any refurbishment and improvements. Some of the expense can be grant aided. The improvements will include an upgrade of the kitchen and the provision of improved toilet accommodation. It is also proposed that the lighting and heating will be modernised. GNOMES recently enjoyed a theatrical night out watching West Side Story at Milton Keynes Theatre. The evening was organised by Kate Curry.


The story line, borrowed from Shakespeare, still had great resonance for the youth of today.

Simon is proposing to present a copy of his researches to the Parish Council as an archive that we all can refer to.

In the Parish Council minutes of 26th April 1919 'it was proposed seconded and unanimously carried that the Memorial for the soldiers of Aston Abbotts who fell in the war be placed in the churchyard of Aston Abbotts'.

<u>ASTON ABBOTTS PARISH PLAN – UPDATE</u>

You may remember at the end of last year there was an article in the Chronicle about a Parish Plan, which was headed "An opportunity for local people to influence local issues." To remind you, here is what it said:

The District Council is currently producing a Local Development Framework which includes outline plans as diverse as affordable housing and transport policy to the provision of play areas and local shops. How can a local community influence the issues and decisions made within this framework? AVDC policy states that information set out in a Parish Plan can provide high level input into issues such as local needs, opportunities and concerns which may, in turn, have a direct impact on planning issues.

What is a Parish Plan? A Parish Plan is a locally inspired vision of how a village should develop; in essence it is an aspiration of how you would like your village to be. With the degree of development outlined in Government policy, the Parish Council felt it important that village opinion should play a significant part in that development through the medium of a Parish Plan.

All that sounds very grand but it will not hold water unless the opinion of the whole village is involved in the final product. A steering committee has been formed but only with the remit of setting the ball rolling, if a villager feels they would like to contribute they are more than welcome to join us.

Well, no-one else has come forward to contribute so far (though you would still be very welcome), and the steering committee has met several times and finally come up with a questionnaire which we hope will provide the foundation on which the Parish Plan will be built.

The purpose of this article is to let you know that this questionnaire will be delivered to all the households in the village in the near future. It is your chance to say how you envisage Aston Abbotts will develop in the future, so please take the time to fill it in, record your comments and return it to the committee who will then endeavour to use your views to make a draft outline of a Parish Plan to present to you.

The process will be an iterative one and, therefore, must remain flexible. Village input is vital for its success, and that means all of the village must get involved. If it appears that the few are dictating to the many the project will be abandoned.





Countryside Matters

Disease, pests and even drought are endangering many of UK's horse chestnut trees. As many as 50,000, around 10%, of the total have bleeding canker which attacks the bark, this causes a dark sticky liquid to ooze from spots and rings on the trunk of the tree. Limbs fall off and eventually the tree falls over. To add to its woes the leaf miner moth then attacks, their larvae eat the leaves. This gives the impression of brown foliage and shows up against the surrounding green landscape, like a premature autumn. The scale of this disaster is spreading rapidly and thousands of trees are going to disappear in the next few years.

Is it my imagination or have we been going through a bad spell with some of our national treasures? Firstly the Dutch elm disease with losses of 30 million trees, then sudden oak death which affects the beech and now the gypsy moth which prefers oak trees and poplars. Let us hope the wonderful conker trees shall withstand this unwelcome onslaught.

To depress you even more the British Beekeepers Association reported up to 30% losses in their bee colonies over the last winter. They put this down not only to varrora mite but also "colony collapse disorder", (sounds like some social services problem in an inner city!). Let us hope a cure is found because bees are essential for pollination of all fruit trees and many arable crops most of all field beans.

On a brighter note, I thought Jimmy Doherty's 'Farming Heroes' was a pure delight. He showed some of the best things about British farming and farmers. It is a joy to listen to a down to earth bloke who tells it as he sees it. I thought it was an honest series, warts and all, showing that farming is hard but a very rewarding lifestyle.

Due to a problem with a tractor tailgate, I am tempted to let my chickens out wandering the road between Ledburn and Crafton, the road this week was covered in a thin layer of wheat. It looked like the local council road gritters had turned up early. I can see much leg pulling imminent at the forthcoming Harvest Supper!! James Henderson

Supper will be a hot three course meal prepared by your 'favorite hostesses'!!


A glass of wine and coffee are included. Drinks and vegetarian alternatives available.


This lovely meal will be followed by an 'entertaining' auction of donated produce.



Aston Abbotts Parish Council Wednesday 17th September 2008

Present: - Cllrs. C Higgs, D Dicken, K Curry, A Stefancyzx, P Shorrock, R Clarke and P Bruton (Clerk). Apologies had been received from J Hardcastle.

The Clerk reported the Annual Audit had been completed and he would post the necessary Notices on the Parish Notice Board as required. The Clerk also advised that he had received notification that Dog waste charges had been reduced from the current rate of £2.22 to £1.89 from 1st October 2008.

The Clerk had received a letter regarding the recycling facility at Tring and he was advised to reply noting that the facility was not in the District although we were aware that it would remain open until a new facility was opened at Aston Clinton. The Clerk drew attention of Councillors to the LTP2 consultation on which he had received a letter, requesting they review the relevant web page for any feedback as the consultation ends on the 17th October 2008.

Final arrangements were being made for the purchase of the equipment for the Church rooms. The Clerk had received a letter from AVDC regarding the s106 monies and he was to write giving details of the monies spent so far.

It was reported that progress was being made on the lease for the Church rooms. A meeting had been held with the Architect and she was to circulate the notes to interested parties in order to progress the matter.

The role of the planning committee was discussed. It was noted that the Agenda for the meetings was the defining point of any decision. It was AGREED that the Chairman would review planning applications and, after appropriate consultation with other members of the planning committee, advise the Clerk whether an application should be included on the Planning Committee or Parish Council Agenda for decision.

The draft Village Plan questionnaire had been completed, it was currently being modified and was targeted to be circulated to parishioners with the November issue of the Chronicle. It was also noted that the article detailing the purpose of the Village plan was being reviewed for inclusion in the October issue.

We had received notification that the village was losing the mobile library service and all expressed their concern at this decision. It was AGREED that the Clerk would complain strongly on behalf of Council at this decision.

It was noted that the telephone box was not working and the Clerk would contact BT to report the matter.

The question of whether we should consider the provision of a mobile Post Office was raised, as some villages are using the facility. After discussion it was AGREED not to pursue at this time.

The Bonfire Night was discussed. Council would contact last year's organisers to ascertain whether they were prepared to continue. We would then put in place the necessary controls and safety requirements. Council AGREED to fund £500 (including VAT). It was noted that volunteers would be required to collect entrance money.

The meeting was updated on the current status of the drainage of surface water from the Hunters Way development. The Clerk advised he had contacted Highways and the Highways Engineer responsible had visited site and raised the matter with the developer. He was to continue monitoring the situation. The Clerk would also continue to progress until a conclusion was reached.

Concerns were expressed over the height of trees affecting streetlights, particularly one by the old Bull & Butcher. It was AGREED that Council would investigate and discuss with the resident who owned the tree to remedy the situation.

The Clerk updated the meeting on the prospect of a footpath from the village to Wingrave crossroads. He had contacted BALC and their advice was to raise the matter with County, also obtaining support of our representatives on County and District Councils. It was AGREED to write to Highways detailing our requirement and the reasons. We should also raise the issue at the forthcoming Local Forum.

It was AGREED to ask Mrs J Hardcastle to represent the Council at the forthcoming Local Forum meeting.

The New Deal document would be reviewed by all and discussed at next month's meeting.

Councillor Peter Cooper advised he had a preliminary meeting with County Council on the adoption of the streetlights at Wingrave cross roads. BCC had to check to see whether this would require a change to policy. He expected to hear the outcome within the next 2 weeks.




ALLOTMENT DIARY

The Germans have a word for which there is no English equivalent. This word is "schadenfreude", which means "the malicious enjoyment of others' misfortunes".

My experience as an allotment-holder, however, enables me to state, quite categorically, that this word is unknown to the allotmenteers of Aston Abbotts. Whenever I have talked to any of them about some problem with the vegetables I have been trying to grow, far from showing any pleasure in my misfortune, the

usual reaction has been to tell me about a similar failure of their crop of the same vegetable – or, if they have not experienced a similar failure, then to offer me part of their crop of the vegetable in question, to make good the void in my harvest.

What brought this to mind were the several conversations I have had recently with fellow allotmenteers about the failure of various crops. Everyone to whom I have spoken has, like me, had a poor year for carrots. In my case about half of the seeds I planted failed to come up. Others found they had to sew carrots several times because none of the first plantings germinated. When I started picking my carrots, I then found that most of the crop was either stunted or misshapen; and the carrots themselves were affected by carrot-fly. Others have had the same problems.



The other thing that has affected most of us is that our cabbage plants have been more than usually devoured by caterpillars. In my case, the butterflies managed to get through the netting I had placed over the plants; but I must admit that the netting was old, and did contain some unintentional holes. In Colin's case, however, the wretched insects managed to get through two layers of netting. On my plot, the caterpillars' preference was clearly for Brussells sprouts, and before I had spotted what was happening, they had reduced these plants to skeletons. Derris dust — the usual remedy - had no effect, and so I was reduced — as were some of my neighbours — to picking the wretched critters off by hand every day, and killing them. I did not count how many I removed, but it must have been hundreds. As a result, I still


have some cabbages. Curiously, I believe that my Brussels sprouts are continuing to grow, even without leaves! I suspect, however, that any crop of sprouts will be small.

Finally, although I have had a good crop of potatoes, I have noticed that more than usual have been attacked by slugs. Why all these things should have happened in the same year, I do not know; and can only assume that they are all connected to the damp and gloomy summer we have just experienced.

If any of my readers have also had problems this year with carrots, cabbages or potatoes, I hope this article will cheer you up, knowing you are not alone! *Peter Shorrock*
